

### PEACEFUL SANCTUARY

Some people have thought about their final resting place far in advance of their end of life. For the majority, it's not necessarily lingering at the forefront of your thoughts. It can be an uncomfortable thought! Whether you feel empowered to make that decision ahead of time or you are making this choice as a loving survivor, it is a choice to make carefully.

Wherever the final resting place might be, it is smart to review any choice that you are considering. Full burials are still popular and require a little homework in deciding on a cemetery. Green Burial is important to some and becoming an option at some of our local cemeteries. Another favorable option is cremation. With cremation there are some things to consider: Does it coincide with religious beliefs? Where should the cremains final resting place be and where can you legally put them? In some cases, do all the family members agree on cremation?

# Life Story Ceremony

### A TIME TO BEGIN HEALING

The following is a excerpt taken from Alan Creedy's blog, "The Creedy Commentary" on Collaborative Healing.

"My friend Karl Jennings of the Acute Loss Center observed a frequent and common behavior in major catastrophes and celebrity deaths. In these events, humans display a visceral need to participate in mutual and common behaviors. The strongest of these is the need to gather, honor and interact physically with others. What made this observation so vivid for Karl, and anyone who understands his theory, is that the need is no less strong in those who don't even know the affected parties.

I have come to believe that human psyche is wired to respond to human suffering in a certain way and that way involves collaborative healing. Funerals, ceremonies, ritual, parties...whatever you want to call it...function for that purpose. In our far-flung, post-industrial world funeral homes function to organize, orchestrate and focus this need."

It's intriguing that cultural transformation has not changed the need to gather and honor. It is innate to gather and support in times of need. Churches are usually the first go-to for setting up a funeral ceremony, but not everyone has a religious affiliation or are fully connected with any church. If a meaningful service is important to you and your family, a Celebrant Service that can be performed right in the funeral home is another alternative.

A Celebrant is a certified professional, trained to help fulfill your personal and spiritual needs in your time of loss. Because of our commitment to providing this option, all of our funeral directors are Certified Celebrants, trained at the In-Sight Institute. We will help guide you in creating a personalized tribute service that reflects the personality and lifestyle of the person being honored.

▶ READINGS
·Religious verses may be relevant if the person we are celebrating was connected to a faith. ·Poems can be more spiritual in their nature. Some can be funny, and this can be appropriate. ·Verses will help to bring out the philosophies of how the person lived their life.
What readings are fitting for your loved one, who will be asked to read them?
▶ REMEMBERING
Remembering is an informal time for family and friends to share memories of the deceased. Do you wish for family and friends to offer stories they recall of shared times? If so, whom?
▶EULOGY
The eulogy is typically an overview of your loved one's life. It is usually prepared by family or closest friends. It is more formal in design. Great eulogies last between 3-5 minutes. They gloss over the surface leaving the opportunity for more intimate story telling shared among family and friends at a later time. # Why would I want to pre-plan my Life Story™ Experience?

### SAVES MONEY.

Funerals are an inevitable expense and can be a financial hardship when your family is not expecting the cost. Many funeral homes offer discounts or payment plans to participants who pre-plan their funeral. Paying off the cost of the funeral over the course of time is often more financially feasable and something worth considering.

## ASK THE QUESTIONS YOU WANT.


When you pre-plan your funeral, you are present and able to ask all the questions that are important to you. You also determine whether or not the answers work for you.

### Pre-Funding Your Life Story<sup>™</sup> Experience

There are two options available for pre-funding your arrangements:

### REVOCABLE

Your arrangements may be funded in a federally insured burial trust account. These funds accrue interest at a very competitive rate and can be withdrawn at any time by the account owner.

### **IRREVOCABLE**

Much confusion surrounds the burial trust that is setup when a loved one enters a nursing home. An irrevocable trust can be established prior to the exhaustion of personal funds on the cost of nursing home care and may include all funeral-related expenses. Although these funds cannot be withdrawn by the owner until death, they are transferable from funeral home to funeral home. Irrevocable accounts are only required for Medicaid recipients.
